# RULES (LAWS) OF DC50

With the DC50 being an 8-a-side mixed gender tournament, we request that each school takes the field with four boys and four girls during each game. You may wish to bring a bigger squad (10) and that is fine, but for balance, we would like a 50/50 split during all games.

- 25mins to complete 50 ball innings
- 5min turn around between innings
- Toss for the next game to take place 10mins before the start of the game.
- All balls bowled from one end.
- Batters retire at 25 and players may return if all wickets have been lost. The final batter acts as 'last player standing' and will bat with a runner.
- Balls bowled in sets of 5
- x1 set per bowler (max x2 sets per bowler)
- Wides & no-balls count for 3 runs and no extra ball, unless it is in the final set of 5 where they only count for one run and are rebowled.
- Maximum of 4 fielders on the legside
- Designated wicket keeper prior to game commencing who shall not be able to bowl.



# SCORING

The tournament in 2026 will be a 'round-robin' league format with each team playing every other in the league stage, with a 3<sup>rd</sup> v 4<sup>th</sup> play-off and 1<sup>st</sup> v 2<sup>nd</sup> as the Final.

3 points for a win, with a Super Set (Super Over) to decide who wins if there is a tie. If teams are on the same number of points at the end of the group stages, league positioning will be decided on a Net Run Rate.

# FOOD & DRINK

This will be provided in the form of a traditional 'cricket tea'. Lunch will be staggered between 12:15-13:00pm.

Coffee, tea, biscuits and 'cricket tea' will be provided throughout the day on the balcony of the main pavilion.

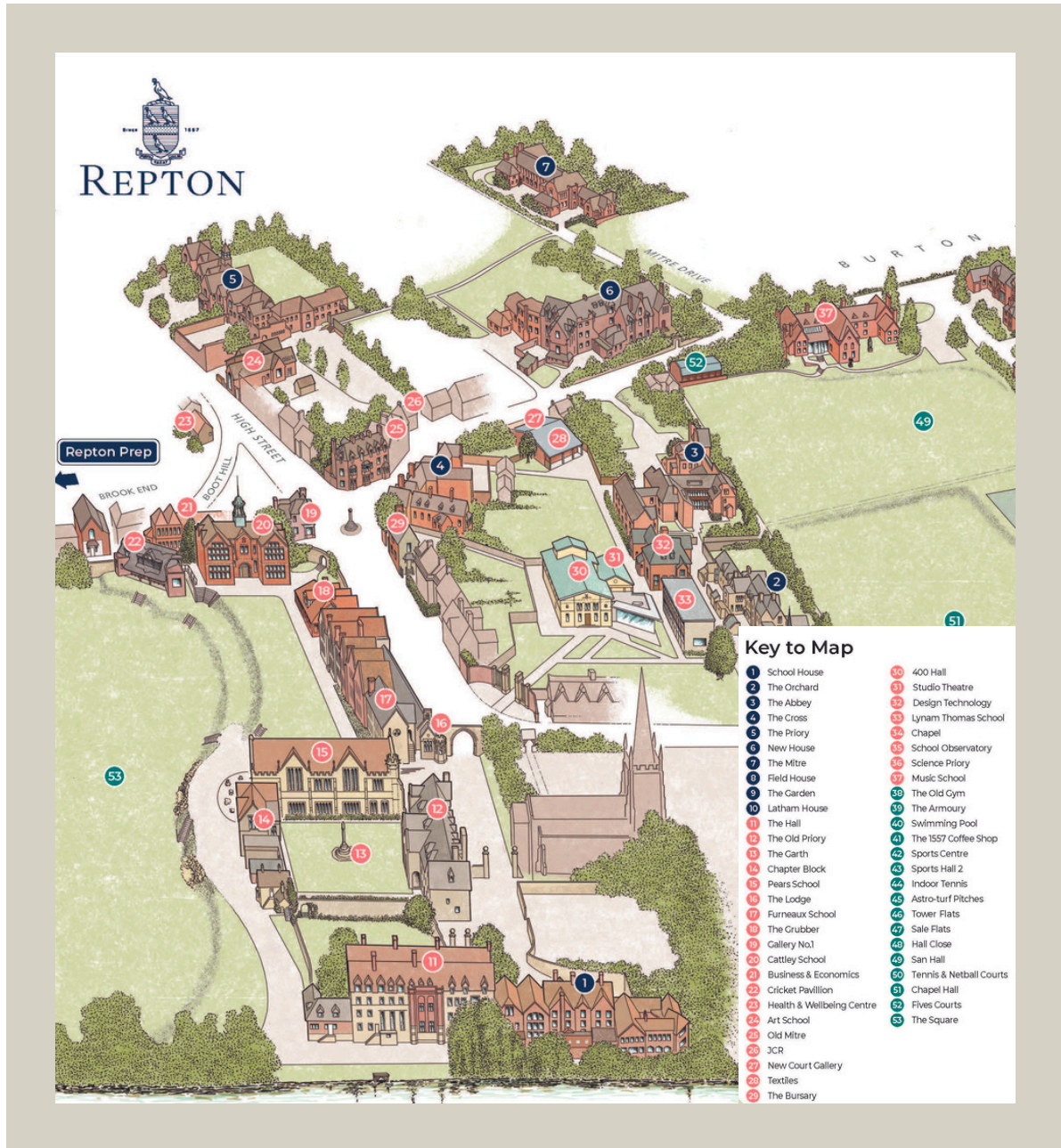


- One-hour player coaching session for all participating teams

To be a Scholar at Repton is a major achievement and one that parents and pupils should be proud.

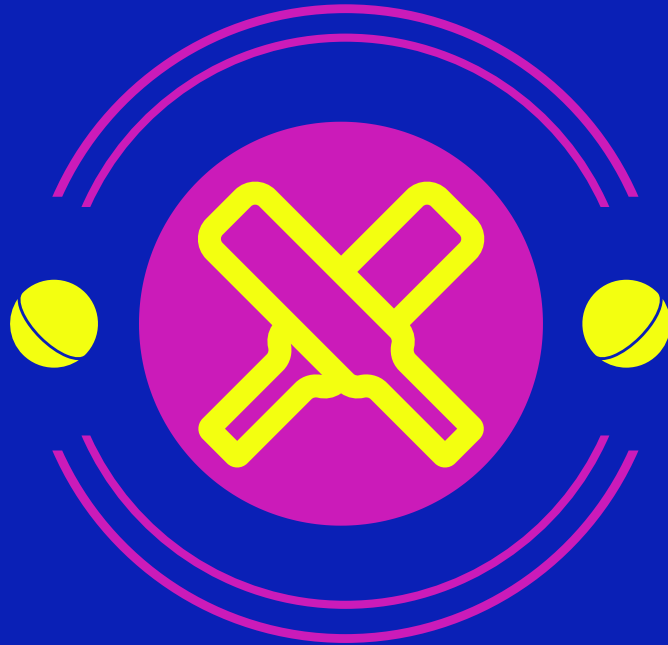
