Extra equipment needed when entering the school

Year 3 and above: pencil, pen, rubber, set of coloured pencils, pencil sharpener, glue stick and a 30cm ruler in a pencil case. Please ensure all items are named.

Year 5 and above: a handwriting pen or a fountain pen with a supply of washable blue ink cartridges. No biros.

Year 6 and above: Transparent protractor, pair of compasses and a FX-83GTX scientific calculator.

All clothing and footwear must be clearly named.

Hair

Short hair must be cut into a neat, short style. Stepped cuts, wedges, patterns etc. and the use of gel or mousse are not accepted.

Longer hair should be tied back with a blue/black/red/ school hair tie to be kept off the face.

In Year 8, pupils may wear their hair down, but it must be tied up for sport and in other situations where this is important for safety.

Jewellery

The only jewellery that may be worn in school is:

- a watch (not a smart watch)
- one simple gold or silver stud in each ear.

Pupils are responsible for any jewellery brought into school. Necklaces, bracelets and rings should not be worn. Earrings and watches must be removed for sport.
