Hair

Longer hair should be tied back with a blue/black/red/ school hair tie to be kept off the face.

In Year 8, pupils may wear their hair down, but it must be tied up for sport and in other situations where this is important for safety.

Jewellery

The only jewellery that may be worn in school is:

- a watch (not a smart watch)
- one simple gold or silver stud in each ear.

Pupils are responsible for any jewellery brought into school. Necklaces, bracelets and rings should not be worn. Earrings and watches must be removed for sport.
