## Welcome

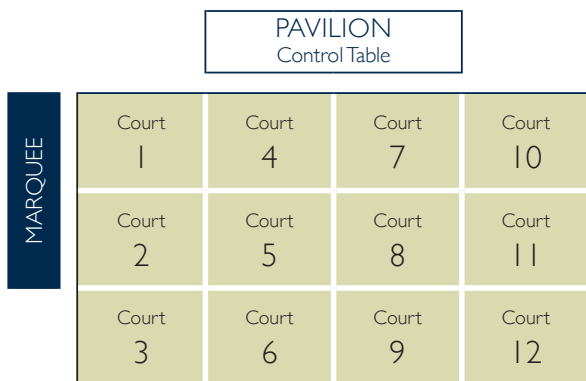

## Tournament Rules

The final standings of each group shall be determined by LTA Regulations for a Round Robin draw as follows:

1. Greatest number of wins.
2. If two teams are tied; the head to head result.
3. If more than two teams are tied, the highest percentage of games won to games played.

### The format for the matches will be as follows:

1. All group matches and semi-finals will be 'first to four games' (4-0, 4-1, 4-2). If the score reaches three games all, a tie-break will be played, with the winner being the first team to gain seven points. In that event the score is 4-3 to the tie break winners.

2. In all finals a normal set will be played (tie break at 6-6).

Knock ups are allowed before a team's first match of the day and before their first match after lunch.

Members of staff i/c teams should report the result of each match to the control table immediately after its conclusion.

The referee has the right to alter the format of the tournament during the course of the day in the event of unforeseen circumstances. The astroturf courts will be used if we are running behind schedule.

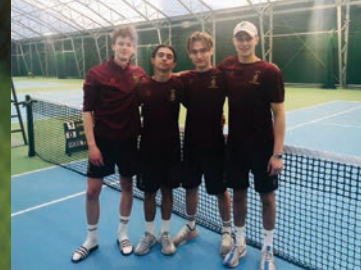

# REPTON

## Tennis at Repton

Repton boasts a fine tradition of great tennis players. Our most famous are H F Lawford, Wimbledon Champion in 1887, and HW (Bunny) Austin, who twice reached the Wimbledon Final in the 1930s.

Over the past 26 years the School has won the Independent Schools' Championship (Youll Cup) 15 times, the Boys' National Schools' Championship (Glanville Cup) 11 times and the Girls' National Schools Championship (Aberdare Cup) on four occasions.

Repton runs an extensive tennis programme for players of all levels of ability, and with 20 courts, including two indoors, pupils spend plenty of time on court.

During the Michaelmas and Lent terms there are three groups in operation:

- **Elite Squad:** made up of the best players in the School who train on a daily basis, have international rankings and travel on the ITF and ETA Circuit.
- **Performance Squad:** composed of players considered to have the potential to become county/regional/national standard players. They will train four sessions per week and have fitness training.
- **Development Squad:** For players of all ages and abilities who wish to train in the winter.

Tennis is the main sport for Repton's girls during the Summer Term and each year group has a full programme of practice and inter-school matches. Boys can also play tennis in the Summer Term with senior and junior squads playing matches against other schools.

To further complement the competitive tennis programme, Repton has U15 girls' and boys' teams that play in the AEGON Team Tennis Schools tournament throughout the year.
